

## **Classroom English: REFERENCES**

Heaton, J.B., 1981 *Using English in the Classroom* (Longman).

A concise textbook for a short course on classroom English. Each chapter focuses on one major teacher task, such as 'giving instructions', 'handling pupils' responses', and 'questioning techniques'. Each chapter contains class language extracts for analysis, an introduction to the communication process involved, suggested classroom expressions, and practical activities.

Gardner B., & Gardner F. (2000). *Oxford Basics: Classroom English*. Oxford: Oxford University Press.

A short handbook on classroom English. Section 1 provides advice on issues such as how to check that learners have understood and when to use English. Section 2 is like a manual, providing lists of classroom expressions that can be used for different classroom situations, such as 'activities in class', 'boardwork', 'games and song'.

Hughes, G.S. (1981). *A Handbook of Classroom English*. OUP

A very comprehensive collection of expressions of classroom English on various aspects of classroom teaching.

Slattery, M., & Willis, J. 2001 *English for Primary Teachers: A Handbook of Activities and Classroom Language* (Oxford UP).

This is a concise textbook for teaching English to young learners. Each unit focuses on one area of primary English teaching, such as 'story activities', 'writing in English', and 'speaking more freely'. Under each theme, a number of classroom activities are suggested. A special feature about this handbook is that in each unit, there are classroom transcripts showing how a teacher sets up the target activity and the language involved. A summary of classroom expressions is also provided. There is an accompanying CD which contains 62 recorded extracts from typical English lessons.
